- Elected president of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
- Co-founder of Scientists and Engineers for America.
- Awarded Commander of the Royal Norwegian Order of Merit, by King Harold V.
- Received 18 honorary doctorates from universities around the world.
- Wrote/co-wrote over 200 scientific publications.
- Lecturer at several hundred universities, institutes, and meetings.
- Awarded Boy Scouts of America Distinguished Eagle Scout Award.
