- Participated in football, hockey and other sports at U of M.
- Started as quarterback on four successive Golden Gophers national championship football teams that were undefeated in 1933, 1934, and 1935, and was captain of the 1935 football team.
- Played in the 1936 College All-Star Game in Chicago, IL.
- Served as assistant coach (five years) at Tulane University, a football powerhouse of the day.
- Worked as an engineer at Minneapolis Honeywell, from WW II until retirement as Vice President of Engineering in 1963.
- Received U of M *Outstanding Achievement Award* for leadership and distinguished work in ordnance and development engineering.
- Worked in several senior-level construction and management jobs; served on Boards of Twin City Federal and Donaldson Company.
- Elected president of U of M Alumni Association in 1956-57.
- Served on the board of the Greater Minneapolis United Fund, chairman of its 1962 campaign.
- Served on boards of Minneapolis Aquatennial, Junior Achievement, and other community organizations.
